# The Minutes of the Meeting of Stockbury Parish Council held in Stockbury Village Hall on the 24th April 2019 at 7:30 PM.

The meeting was chaired by Parish Cllr Woods.

# 1. Apologies.

Apologies were received from Cllrs Southern and Mace, MBC Councillor Garten and KCC Councillor Shellina Prendergast.

#### 3. Minutes of the previous Meeting.

The Minutes of the previous meeting were circulated to all present. These were proposed by Cllr Cathcart as a true record, this was seconded by Cllr Tomsett and agreed by all present.

The Minutes were then signed and dated by the Chairman of the meeting.

## 4. Matters Arising.

Memorial Bench at Church – Cllr Tomsett circulated bench options and designs to all members for their consideration.

Following a discussions bench was selected at a cost of £697.00. It was agreed that the Parish Council would finance the cost of this. Cllr Tomsett reported that a resident had offered to install the bench free of charge.

It was agreed that Cllr Tomsett would order the bench on behalf of the Parish Council.

Cllr Tomsett asked members to consider the wording for the memorial plaque for the bench.

Cllr Cathcart reported that flytipping in the parish on 29<sup>th</sup> March had been removed the next day by MBC.

It was confirmed that the letter of complaint to MBC Enforcement regarding Appsmoor Farm had been submitted as agreed at the previous meeting and a response was now awaited.

Bus shelters on A249 were discussed and it was agreed that the insurance cover for these needed to be clarified.

## Appsmoor Farm Light pollution

The Chairman confirmed that the letter of complaint regarding the lighting at this site had been submitted to MBC to challenge their decision.

Cllr Tomsett stated that concerns had been raised regarding activities on land next to the War Games site. He stated that a skip company was operating on the site and they were holding regular bonfires, in addition the site appeared to have been cleared of trees.

Concerns were raised by members regarding the loss of Woodland and the burning of commercial waste.

Action: Clerk to report to Environmental Health and copy to MBC Planning Enforcement.
