Pandemic Response

The Parish Council, in conjunction with parishioners and the Church, are putting together a plan to support the physical and emotional needs of older and vulnerable people during the crisis arising from the pandemic. At the time of writing, we do not know whether the Inquiry will be going ahead as planned. As the Government is advising against public meetings during the pandemic, we expect it to be delayed again but a decision will not be made by the Inspector until sometime during week commencing 23rd March. That being said, the deadline for submission of evidence and notice that you want to speak at the Inquiry remains 6th April.

Coronavirus (COVID-19)

COVID-19 is a new illness that can affect your lungs and airways. It's caused by a virus called coronavirus.

Stay at home to stop coronavirus spreading

Everyone must stay at home to help stop the spread of coronavirus.

This includes people of all ages – even if you do not have any symptoms or other health conditions.

You can only leave your home:

- **to shop for basic essentials** – only when you really need to
- **to do one form of exercise a day** – such as a run, walk or cycle, alone or with other people you live with
- **for any medical need** – for example, to visit a pharmacy or deliver essential supplies to a vulnerable person
- **to travel to and from work** – but only where this is absolutely necessary

What to do if you have Coronavirus Symptoms

Continue to stay at home if you have either:

- **a high temperature** - this means that if you feel hot to

touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)

- **a new, continuous cough** - this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)

To protect others **do not** go to places like a GP surgery, pharmacy or hospital. Stay at home and consult the NHS online help facility. Please only call the 111 NHS coronavirus helpline if you cannot get help online.

Who is at high risk?

You **may** be at risk of coronavirus if you:

- have had an organ transplant
- are having certain types of cancer treatment
- have blood or bone marrow cancer, such as leukaemia
- have a severe lung condition, such as cystic fibrosis or severe asthma
- have a condition that makes you more likely to get infections
- are taking a medicine that weakens your immune system
- are pregnant and have a serious heart condition

Advice for people at high risk

If you are at high risk of getting seriously ill from coronavirus, there are extra things you should do to avoid catching it. These include:

- not leaving your home - you should not go shopping, visit family or friends, attend gatherings
- avoid close contact with others in your home as much as possible.

WE ARE HERE FOR YOU

What a week! Whoever would have expected this just a few days ago. We live in unprecedented, turbulent times when many are anxious about the present never mind the future following the various Government announcements during the week. You will be aware that following the letter issued by the Archbishops of Canterbury and York on 17th March 2020, **all** Church of England public worship services are currently suspended. The Methodist Church, which has congregations in this area, has taken similar steps.

BUT WE ARE STILL HERE FOR YOU

As the church community in your village community (C of E & Methodists together) we are engaging where we can to work with others in the village community, with the parish councils so that together we help and support everyone where we can, looking out especially for the most vulnerable in our communities. As voucher holders for the Sittingbourne Foodbank we can liaise to arrange for parcels to be provided so that no-one need go without the essentials. We would like to encourage generosity in providing some essentials for the Foodbank if possible.

The church building in your village will sadly be closed during the coming weeks, however we will be praying for your village community each day at set times as follows:

- Monday to Friday: at 12 noon & 5pm
- Sundays: 10.30am. We invite everyone to light a candle/place a light in the window each Sunday evening @ 7pm starting this Mothering Sunday

We hope to mark these times of prayer by ringing of one of the church bells. One of our ministers will be in each church of The Six at that time to pray. We invite you to pause and join in wherever you are, praying as you can at those times; we will be encouraging everyone in our congregations to do so.

We are aware that many may be worried and struggling in some way during this period. Do not struggle alone. There are many who can help and listen. Do ask. If you wish for help from our churches, do contact me in the first instance. I can then put you in touch with others in the communities who can and are willing to help.

"The light shines in the darkness, but the darkness has not (cannot) overcome this light". These words from John's Gospel remind us of God's promise that no matter what life brings the Lord says *"I am with you"*. In the midst of the storms the Lord Jesus met his panicked disciples and said *"It is I, do not be afraid. Where is your faith?"* In the midst of this particular storm engulfing our individual lives, our nation and our world at this time may we hear the Lord's promise *"I am with you"*.

As such, I will continue to serve the community to the best of my abilities. **Please feel free to call on my assistance whenever needed.**

Kent County Council (KCC) will provide a single point of contact and triaging requests for support. Maidstone will be setting up local arrangements for referrals to our housing and inclusion officers and others and co-ordinating with the local voluntary and community sector.

In addition the government is making changes impacting on discharge of people from hospital to create capacity for COVID19 patients. This is likely to increase demand for our hospital to home service as well as care homes, community bed facilities and social services. As things stand today – we are managing to respond to demands on this.

Maidstone Borough Council is continuing service delivery to the residents and businesses of the borough and, where needed, activating business continuity plans to ensure this is achieved. We are also setting up new services and arrangements particularly to support vulnerable people in the community and businesses who are experiencing significant economic challenges.

Maidstone is fortunate to have an excellent ICT service, which enables extensive home working; it was tried and tested as part of our Brexit preparations last year. Some of our services cannot be delivered in this way and so we are working closely with service managers across the authority to ensure that our high priority services continue to be provided uninterrupted.

Essentially we strive to do as much "business as usual" and the Authority continues to send out Council Tax statements and invoices for rent and services in the usual way. Where possible we have highlighted what people should do if they are unable to pay. The Government is about to provide a grant to support households which are in receipt of Council Tax support; as I write, we are still awaiting details.

Financial enforcement services including debt collection, Council Tax and benefits fraud will continue to operate, although some pragmatic operational steps will be taken.

Maidstone will continue to give high priority to our housing advice, homelessness support and rough sleeping outreach and support services. The Link in King Street however will be closed for face to face customers. We have put alternative arrangements in place for the most vulnerable of our customers – including a free phone service for people seeking homelessness advice. The DWP (Department of Work & Pensions) will remain open, as they have seen an increase in the number of people needing support.

We are working with Kent County Council and the other 11 district councils to set up a structured system covering the whole county – and drawing on local voluntary and community sector expertise and resources in order to provide access to food, medicines and other supplies in the first instance.

We will receive details of people needing support via the NHS and then signpost/connect them to a network of organisations to provide support. We are working with other public sector organisations including the Kent Fire and Rescue Service and key organisations including AgeUK, Involve Kent and the Citizen Advice Bureau (CAB). We are linking with local health care including GPs, pharmacy service and the Kent Association of Local Councils (KALC).

AgeUK is to extend their paid for services to help all over 50's who are vulnerable and feel isolated.

They offer:

- 2 course hot meals freshly cooked, delivery to your home Monday to Friday
- a shopping service for those who are not able to get out for their food supplies etc

Following the Chancellor's announcements, the council is gearing up to passport funding to eligible businesses as quickly as possible. Amongst other things we are ensuring that all businesses in the retail, hospitality and leisure sectors will benefit immediately for the 100% business rates discount. There will be no need for businesses to apply for the relief. We will be sending revised bills during the course of the next week to those businesses that qualify. Further grants to eligible small businesses with properties of a rateable value up to £51,000 will receive them as soon as we are given the necessary guidance from the Government Department (BEIS).

All businesses in receipt of small business rates relief – regardless of sector – will be eligible for a cash payment of £10,000, in a similar way to that set out above. Whilst there is no need for small businesses to apply for the grant, MBC will be writing to advise those that qualify setting out what they need to do to.

Relaxing Parking Restrictions

MBC has taken the decision to temporarily relax parking restrictions for resident parking bays with immediate effect until 1 July 2020. The increased number of people working from home is creating a number of exceptional circumstances and we are happy to review arrangements where necessary.

This morning, I said to my friend that birth-rates will be increasing dramatically in 9 months. She replied: "so will divorce rates". Please bear in mind that during social isolation, domestic abuse will become even more prevalent.

1 in 4 Women and **1 in 5** men in the UK are victims of domestic abuse in their lifetime. **SIX** women a week lose their life to either their partner, ex-partner or by taking their own lives as a result of Domestic Abuse. **28** men a year are killed by women.

Not all abuse is physical, control and coercion are far more common forms of abuse, focussing on areas such as financial control, isolation, behaviour control.


