# Patrik Says ....

#### Dear Residents

Great uproar sounded through the village a few weeks ago because some very unauthorised development happened in Plum Tree Lane at Cherry Trees Farm.

## Did I not say in the past that local government works by statistics?

My point was proven when more than a dozen complaints were lodged on the council's website. Before the week was out an enforcement officer slapped a temporary stop notice on the culprit.

Unlike planning breaches, contraventions against a stop notice are a criminal offence.

Today I read that a planning application has been filed. It looks like the problem will hover about the village like a bad dragon for a while, with appeals and the like. Good to know however, that MBC is with the people of Stockbury this time.

Just to give you a clear picture, a young family own the front part of the site and have permission. However, the owner sold off the field to a young gentleman who in turn has sold it on to an Irish Gypsy family. The original owner went away for a weekend and when he came back they had done the work. He is devastated and I would hate the locals to think that he is responsible.

## Going back to my first point: Like all government departments, the police works on statistics too !

Please report **ALL** incidents to police, however minor. Suspicious behaviour should be reported to 101 or 01622 690690. 101 costs £0.15 per call and experience shows that the local number sometimes gets answered faster.

Obviously, crime in progress must be reported on 999.

Theft and other crime which is not urgent can be reported online

#### www.kent.police.uk/services/report-online/kentpolice-online-reporting/

If you do not report crime we will slip down in the force's list of priority areas, as their statistics show no crime. In other words, if you shout loudest you'll get the best service.

#### And while I am in my ranting mode about statistics:

The same goes for fly-tipping. Please report **ALL** fly-tipping and littering to Maidstone:

#### www.maidstone.gov.uk/home/do-it-online/report-it

Recently the IT department made improvements to the map. You must mark the point on the road, not next to it. If necessary, please zoom in.

Any problems with the software or reported tips not being removed within 3 days please contact me, preferably also email me the report's reference number.

The online reporting will be automatically transferred to the operators' vans. Even if you would report it by phone, the call-handler would use the same online system like you. Therefore it will be best if you use the online reporting facility yourself - if possible.

If there are several tips in the vicinity, please file a report for each one individually! As I said, Local Government works by numbers. Plus, your report will also be forwarded to the Environment Agency for national statistics !

#### And while I probably bored you stiff by now about online reporting and statistics, just two more things:

There is a neat little app for your mobile phone, called "Country Eye". This allows you to report all of the above and more (like potholes!) all at a touch of a button, provided you have mobile coverage - but that's another story.....

Lastly, I already mentioned it last month: the Kent Downs Management Plan is currently being reviewed. Please get involved and feed into the revision of the plan - it is only a 10min survey. <u>www.surveymonkey.co.uk/r/RCJVRDC</u>

There is so much more I wanted to say but again, I ran out

of page space. (Ed, how about a bi-weekly Observer?) (No

harm in dreaming Patrik! - Ed) For now I am looking forward to next month's edition; leaving you with a very, very last urgent one:

# Stockbury Gardeners

Monday 16<sup>th</sup> April, 6 rows of brassica seedlings planted out all in perfect straight rows, marathon calabrese, winter brussel sprouts, red cabbage, 3 varieties of cauliflower all watered in and perfect. Tuesday 17<sup>th</sup> April 28 degrees and bright sun hot enough to fry an egg on concrete. Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> April, telephone call to pals and garden centre Dobbies, "my veg has fried can you help with replacements?".....enough said.

As a point you should always harden off seedlings before planting out by slowly introducing them to the elements.

Tips this month.

- Watch out for supermarkets selling cut and come again lettuce, if you carefully pull the seedlings because that is what they are, apart you will find that there are probably hundreds of different varieties of possible lettuce that you can plant out and grow.
- For cordon grown tomatoes pinch out side growths, these are the growths appearing in the crook of the stem and large leaves, simply remove them.
- With the early onset of the great orange ball in the sky, it's a reminder to shade any plants in the greenhouse.
- Its time to sow outside now, spring onions, carrots, potatoes, leeks, parsnips, herbs, in fact most vegetables still in your seed store can be sown by now, except for basil.
- Roses need feeding and watch for blackspot and mildew.
- Cut your lawn but the first cuts should not be too short, rather best done in stages. A wellmanicured lawn and straight edges gives the best impression for visitors.

This month the gardeners have their annual hanging basket workshop on the 1<sup>st</sup> May, members (still time to join for this year!!) should bring up to a maximum of 2 baskets and liners, we supply the compost, ingredients, and plants, you just need to pay for these.

May the 6<sup>th</sup> sees Upchurch Garden Society having their annual plant sale in the paddock at 9am.

I know it seems improbable, but it can still happen .....a frost, so beware!

Right - a keen gardener spotted in Stockbury improving his soil by building and filling a raised bed.
