Stockbury Roundabout

One day, I hope to be able to write about something other than the roundabout but in the meantime ...

This month's bumper instalment features the exit from Church Hill onto the A249 and the very brief road closure on Friday night / Saturday morning.

Church Hill

Several reports were received of dangerous incidents at the bottom of Church Hill. These included people using the grass verge to get past cars waiting to get onto the A249 and some extremely dangerous U-turn behaviour. The Parish Council discussed this junction with the team from National Highways (NH) at the last liaison meeting. They re-iterated their view that the closure of Honeycrock Hill and the diversion of slower traffic onto Church Hill has not made the junction more dangerous (according to their computer modelling). The fact that the deceleration lane on the southbound carriageway occasionally spills over into the live outside lane aroused some interest but was not seen as a problem.

NH did however agree to monitor the junction for a short while. The eagle eyed amongst you will have noticed that a portable CCTV camera has now been placed at the bottom of Church Hill. This is solely intended as a monitoring tool for NH; although footage may be made available to the police if requested, anyone who has an accident at the junction will not be allowed access to any of the recordings.

I would strongly advise everyone to consider getting a dash cam fitted to their vehicles which can provide a view to the right when exiting Church Hill.

The Weekend 'Closure'

As you may know, the A249 northbound was left open up to Rumstead Lane, primarily at the request of the Kent Showground. Any vehicles heading north were to be directed to make a U-turn at Rumstead Lane and return down the A249 to the M20. Unfortunately, NH had not taken into account the "particular" nature of many A249 users. As a result, quite a few cars escaped into the lanes and one HGV made it as far as South Green via Rumstead Road! The main problem was that several vehicles decided to continue towards the Stockbury roundabout by travelling the wrong way up the southbound carriageway. One even made it as far as the roundabout. Whether this was a problem with the signage or whether it was just stupidity on the behalf of drivers, will probably never be known. Following consultation with the police, NH decided that they had to abandon the closure (and works) for safety reasons.

Unfortunately, NH forgot to tell anyone in Stockbury!

Urgent Road Closure

CHALKY ROAD, STOCKBURY 31st January, 2022

It will be necessary to close Chalky Road, Stockbury from 31st January 2022 for up to 5 days to enable urgent drainage works to be carried out by Kent County Council.

The road will be closed at the junction of A249 Sittingbourne Road. The alternative route is via Church Lane, Hill Green Road, South Street Road, Chalky Road.

Temporary Road Closure

YELSTED ROAD, YELSTED 1st February 2022

It will be necessary to close part of Yelsted Road, Yelsted from 1st February 2022, with estimated completion by 3rd February 2022.

Yelsted Road will be closed in the general vicinity of Chapel Cottage, to the extent indicated by signs and barriers on site.

The alternative route for any through traffic is via South Street Road, West Wood Road, Plum Tree Lane, Hill Green Road, Cradles Road, Lower Hartlip Road, Yelsted Road and vice versa.

The closure is required for the safety of the public and workforce while repair works are undertaken by South East Water.

Kent Fraud Alert

Fake Banking App Alert

We are urging anyone considering buying or selling goods online to be vigilant about a scam involving a fake bank transfer app.

Sellers using sites such as Facebook Marketplace, eBay and Gumtree, have reported incidents of fraudsters using a fake banking app to pretend to pay for goods they have agreed to purchase.

The app creates an image which shows a money transfer has been made. We have been advised that offenders have been targeting vulnerable individuals including the elderly in the UK.

If you have been a victim of this type of scam, then report it to Action Fraud at www.actionfraud.police.uk or calling 0300 123 2040.

Social Media Scams

Be mindful when using Social Media, scammers see it as a great way of "conning you" out of your cash.

Messages saying "is this you in a video" seem to be doing the rounds at the moment. The scammers try to get you to click on a link, which is likely to be harmful and may deliver malicious malware into your system.

Remember never click on links unless you have confirmed that it is genuine.

If you think that you may have been a victim of this type of scam, then contact your Bank immediately and report it to Action Fraud at www.actionfraud.police.uk or calling 0300 123 2040.

Romance Scams

Romance Scammers are manipulative and spend lots of time researching their victim and getting to a position where they can apply pressure and panic them into sending money without thinking to assist with a non-existent medical emergency etc.

If you are currently speaking to someone you have met online, ask yourself these questions,

- Shortly after meeting them online, they told you that they are madly in love and want a relationship?
- They say that their job means they work abroad a lot and cannot meet at the moment?
- They always have an excuse for not meeting or speaking via a video chat?
- They have sent pictures that appear to be professionally taken and are posing in front of mountains or they are in uniform or with a group of work colleagues?
- They have given you a "hard luck" story and ask for your help financially?
- Have they told you to keep the relationship secret and not tell family and friends?

If you can answer 'yes' to some or all the above, you may be a victim of a Romance Fraud. Report this to us by calling 101 and contact your bank immediately.

Stockbury Book Club

The Lamplighters by Emma Stonex

This popular novel is based on a true story about three lighthouse keepers who disappeared without explanation in 1900 while working on a lighthouse in the Outer Hebrides. The setting has been altered to the wild Cornish coast and the date changed to the late 90's but the main similarity of an unsolved disappearance remains.

In the novel, when the lighthouse is explored, the entrance door is found to be locked, there is an unfinished meal on the table and the clocks have stopped. Not a sign of the three men who were living and working there remained.

The story moves between the lighthouse and the three women who are still looking for answers two decades later. The reader is given several explanations as to what happened but the ending is inconclusive with few clues to support these ideas. When we began reading the book, most of us were keen to discover why and how the men disappeared but were disappointed with the conclusion as many questions were still left unanswered.

What we did enjoy was learning about how the lighthouse was managed by the keepers and how they coped with the isolation. Some of us found the characterisation good and the atmosphere and descriptions of the ocean and the weather were well written.

A suggestion which may be helpful would be to listen to the story on 'Audible' which was enjoyed by one of our group.

Overall, we weren't too impressed by the novel and gave it a score of 4.5.

The Confidence Men by Margalit Fox

This is a new novel telling the true story of "how two prisoners of War engineered the most remarkable escape in history".

In the First World War, some captured British officers were held in remote Turkish camps and this book relates how two of these men were determined to escape. How they did this was with a clever psychological hoax which initially began with an Ouija board. They engaged their Turkish captors in an elaborate and complex scam and eventually did gain their freedom.

This is an historical book with a large number of references, notes and details and it was this aspect, which did deter some of our group from either starting or finishing it. However, 3 members found the book fascinating and once they had read the first couple of chapters were hooked and really enjoyed the rest. They admired the two officers who organised the hoax with their brilliant memories and ability to use psychological techniques and this led to an interesting discussion in the group about the history of psychology and the power of suggestion in many aspects of our lives today.

We did all agree that the actual true story was padded

out with historical information and really found the small print a bit of a problem.

The novel received a score of 7.

At The Risk of Teaching One's Grandmother ...! Did You Know?

In advance of the serious intent of this article, perhaps you would care to read a short note which a friend told me appeared on some European church noticeboards :

On the other hand, it is not likely He will contact you by phone.

Thank you for turning off your phone.

If you would like to talk to God, come in, choose a quiet place, and talk to Him.

However, should you like to see Him, send Him a text whilst driving.

But seriously, we all know that rather tragic and sad circumstances surround accidents where drivers have been concentrating on their mobiles rather than on the road in front of them. To confront this escalating situation some new rules and regulations have become law this year, 2022.

I guess some of you may well know about these but it is worth refreshing the memory for the sake of you, your family and the wider world. Under new laws which have been introduced it will be a lot easier for the police to prosecute people for using their phones while driving because,

'Those in charge of vehicles that can cause the greatest harm in the event of a collision bear the greatest responsibility to take care and reduce the danger they pose to others.'

(Direct quote from the new Highway Code), briefly this is how things stand now :-

- Drivers will still be allowed to have a phone for sat nav, provided it is secured in a cradle
- Drivers are banned from using the phone to take photos or videos
- Drivers caught will face a fine of £200 and six points on their licence
- Exceptions will still be made in emergency situations
- People may also use their phones to make contactless payments whilst stationary e.g. at a drive-thru or at a toll booth and NOT FOR GENERAL ONLINE payments OR FOR GROCERY SHOPPING

Please do check out these new restrictions in detail. If you drive a motorised vehicle essentially you are in control of a lethal weapon!

Oh, and finally, from January 1st this year, insurers are banned from quoting existing customers a higher price for renewing their insurance than they'd pay if they were new customers. Worth checking don't you think?

Patrik Says ...

Welcome to this month's edition. Obviously, the usuals are simmering in the background: Local Plan Review, constitutional changes etc. but to report there is nothing new. So let me start with some national news:

The **Landscapes Review's final report** was published in 2019 after the government asked for an independent review into whether the protections for National Parks and AONBs are still fit for purpose. The review was led by Julian Glover and supported by an experienced advisory group. There is much to welcome in the Government's long-awaited response this month as it sets out actions to boost nature recovery, mitigate climate change, improve people's access to nature and safeguard our protected landscapes for future generations, all of which closely link to our recently-adopted AONB Management Plan.

However, the Government proposals, as currently presented, fall short of the ambitious, transformational change that Julian Glover and his team envisaged. Of most immediate concern is what appears to be a continuing failure to match expectations with resources, or to grasp the serious financial predicament facing AONBs across England, including the Kent Downs. Chronic under-funding was a central issue identified by Glover's review.

Hospitality, leisure and accommodation businesses are being contacted by Maidstone Borough Council to check if they are eligible for the new **Omicron one off government business grant**.

The Council has acted quickly to make sure that all eligible businesses can claim the new grant of up to £6,000 and is emailing eligible businesses to invite them to make a claim.

Hospitality businesses were really relying on Christmas to help increase their trade and unfortunately the growth in the Omicron variant put paid to this. The new government grant will hopefully help, if only in a small way.

Maidstone Borough Council (MBC) and BBS Construction are calling on **artists to submit**

proposals to develop a piece of public art for the new café building within Mote Park.

The artwork is to last a minimum of 10 years and there is strong preference for it to be based on the history of Mote Park, possibly incorporating memories of the past, people and children in the park over the years. Artists should consider how their piece of public art could be used to raise the profile and celebrate not just Mote Park but Maidstone and its heritage.

This is a fantastic opportunity for an artist to create something that will leave a lasting mark in Maidstone. Artists are free to work in any medium and to interpret the history of Mote Park theme in any way they wish, to explore new technologies and creative ideas for the design and development of the public art.

The new café in Mote Park is a key part of MBC's plans to regenerate the park and encourage both new and returning visitors into the county town. It is expected to open in Summer 2022 and will include indoor and outdoor seating, flexible space for learning, an educational and meeting area for local schools and community groups to hire and new modern toilet facilities.

MBC is on a mission, asking everyone to play their part in helping to **keep the borough clean and tidy**. After the first Covid lockdown MBC saw a massive 250% increase in roadside littering. In 2020 Council teams removed over 1950 tons of waste which had been illegally disposed of on the highways across the Borough. Additionally, the start of every new year sees a 20% rise in waste including household waste, fly-tipping and illegal carriers offering to remove it.

To combat the problem MBC has introduced the **#CleanUpMaidstone** campaign encouraging everyone to play their part and help to eliminate litter now and for future generations.

The Waste Crime and Street Cleansing teams have a zero tolerance policy and will fine anyone who is caught committing a littering offence. Their team of 34 people work tirelessly to clean the streets, retrieve the litter and clear the roads of fly-tipping across the borough.

Council officers successfully applied 265 enforcement actions between 1 January 2020 and 30 September 2021 for waste offences. The team also seized 45 vehicles during the same 18-month period. Don't forget, I told you recently about our new camera technology to help identify more people littering from their vehicles. And, if you are disposing of your rubbish, please ensure that your contractors have the correct waste carriers licence. You can check it via the government website: www.gov.uk/guidance/access-the-public-register-for-environmental-information. If you commission a dodgy contractor who fly-tips your waste, you can be held responsible.

Cooking with Zeina

Zeina's Sunglovia Olive Palat

So in my free time, I write. I write recipes (for our most excellent village paper), I write articles on international politics and I also write a fantasy novel that may never see the light of day. Being always in search of the next Yum, I sometimes make up dishes that don't actually exist (or perhaps I've simply not come across them yet ...)

Here's an excerpt:

"Adara was sat in a cobblestoned square in Sunglo, enjoying a Palat – a popular Sunglo street snack that consisted of multiple layers of thin crisp pastry layered with melted cheese, tomato sauce and ground black olives. It was divine. Greasy. Likely to give her awful acid reflux. Perfect."

Upon googling, a similar recipe seems to already exist in Bulgaria - so FYI I'm not breaking any new ground here. On to the fantasy recipe for the Sunglovia Palat Tower:

Ingredients:

- Black and green olives, drained, 300g
- Filo sheets, 600g
- Cheddar (mature or mild), 200g
- Olive oil, 3tbsp
- Extra Virgin Olive Oil, for drizzling
- Tomatoes, 8
- Stock cube, to taste (in place of salt)
- Black pepper, to taste
- Fresh basil, half a handful

The Magic:

- This recipe involves significant crunch, so we'll be baking the filo sheets separately beforehand. Lightly brush the sheets with olive oil and bake in a preheated oven at 180°C until crispy and lightly brown. May need to be done in batches. Once done, set aside but don't cover. Must retain the crunch.
- Properly drain, dry and seed the olives (if needed). Put in a food processor and grind until you have a crumbly mix. Don't let this be a paste or it'll make everything squidgy later on. Set aside in the fridge, and maybe use a kitchen towel to mop up any excess juices from time to time.
- Shred the cheddar and set aside in the fridge.
- Cut the tomatoes and put them in a pan with a few tablespoons of water. Cover and cook on low.
- When the tomatoes are beginning to break down, add a little of the stock cube. You won't need much. Add the black pepper.
- When the tomato sauce is beginning to dry and stick to the bottom of the pan, taste for salt (if too salty, add water and more tomatoes and repeat the process). If too bland, add a bit more of the stock cube. Be careful, too much salt is depressing.
- Add the rest of the olive oil and fry the sauce until it glistens. Set aside.
- Right after you make the tomato sauce, you need to begin assembling - this is so the heat of the tomato sauce will melt the cheese. And melted cheese is the height of Yum. So you need to be making the tomato sauce just before serving.
- Begin by placing a little sauce on the plate to stabilise

- the tower. Now layer the filo pastry crisp alternating the three fillings: cheese, olive paste and tomato sauce. Drizzle a little extra virgin olive oil (if needed) and basil from time to time.
- When you reach the final crisp filo pastry level, take the palm of your hand and - gently - crush down.
- Garnish with a basil leaves and serve immediately. This doesn't age well. Eat it ... and quickly!

Not sure what you'd have this with, I suggest having it on its own with some iced tea. Open to suggestions ...

(Please, Ed, step in?) (Mmmm?? - Ed)
