English National Concessionary Travel Scheme (ENCTS)

Bus Pass Renewals Please read

The English National Concessionary Travel Scheme (ENCTS - also known as the older persons bus pass) is a statutory national scheme providing free bus travel for individuals of a pensionable age or some pass holders who qualify on the basis of disability. There are approximately 290,000 pass holders across the County.

Passes are issued with a 5 year expiry and as a consequence, every 5 years KCC experiences a significant peak in renewals which needs to be managed. In March 2018, 195,000 passes currently in circulation expire.

An approach of 'intelligent auto-renewals' whereby the majority of existing pass holders, if using their pass recently, will automatically be sent a new pass in advance of their current one expiring i.e. the pass holder does not need to reapply.

However, it has been identified that a significant proportion of passes have not been used in the last year and so these will not be automatically renewed. It should be clearly understood that this is in no way the removal of a right to hold a pass but KCC will be seeking confirmation from the pass holder that they still wish to be issued with one. These pass holders will be written to and advised of their continued right to hold a pass together with instructions as to how to renew.

Letters will be sent out throughout January, February and the first week of March and all automatically renewed or renewals applied for on time will be sent to pass holders before the expiry of current passes on March 31st.

Patrik Says

Planning!!

Where did the last four weeks go? I did not have many local issues to deal with, so what to write about? Maybe something for the gardener? Do you like to watch grass grow? Then you must be a regular web cast viewer of Full Council meetings!

If thats so, you had a rude awakening on the 6th of November. A really heated debate was to be watched!

You may remember that in April the Planning Committee decided against an application regarding Woodcut Farm / Junction 8 Business Park. The officers invoked the Planning Referrals Committee, a committee of three members, in the hope to overrule the 13 member Planning Committee's decision. Thankfully they failed.

The Maidstone Constitution allows for such an action, if the officers think that the Planning Committee's decision cannot be upheld upon appeal and will therefore cost the Council a bomb in legal fees.

This referral caused a lot of upset all around, and you may have read about it in the local press. As a result of this bitter experience, the Democracy Committee proposed, at Full Council, a change of constitution:

Any planning referral should be heard by all members at Full Council, so that all elected Councillors will take joint political responsibility for any highly controversial and possibly costly decision by the Planning Committee.

A wise proposal, you may think. Unfortunately the leading Liberal Party did not think so and hijacked a simple and sensible idea. At Full Council they amended the Democracy Committee's proposal, so that any planning referral will now go to the 15 member Policy and Resources Committee, which is heavily dominated by the Liberals and their supporting friends. A very un-liberal decision!

What does this mean in practice?

What a lot of people do not realise is that the elected politicians on the Planning Committee (as well as those on the Licensing Committee) are not carrying out a political function at all!

The decision-making procedure at Planning Committee is very much guided by legal rationale and laws, rather than political will. The Planning Committee fulfils a quasi-judicial function (being an elected legal judge) and NOT a political one.

- I know, you are surprised, aren't you?

So, if a planning application becomes so outrageous that members of the Planning Committee simply cannot agree with the legal rationale, because they fear the wroth of the electorate, then they may come to a decision, which may be brave but very likely to be successfully appealed in the courts.

If such a decision should be taken, then you can rest assured that their decision will be referred to the Policy & Resources Committee, whose brief is to guard the Borough's finances.

Oh yes, I forgot to mention, there was a by-election recently which we Conservatives lost. The Liberals are now the strongest force on the Council. In Maidstone the difference between Liberals and Conservatives is that the former are the townies and we are the urbanites.

Roll on 2018 ! Does this mean that the rurals get concreted over while "outrageous" urban planning applications will be fended off ?

Did any of you manage to visit The Harrow over the festive period? What a fantastic atmosphere it now has, log fires and friendly staff, fantastic food and an extensive range of drinks. For those of you that did visit I hope that you managed to enjoy the decorations placed in the windows, these were provided by Lex and Jackie from the Gardener's Society, a fantastic show of what can be done with some garden material and a bit of thought and a lot of skill, well done to both. Oh, and of course Samuel, Ellie and the staff at the pub.

The Gardeners do not meet in Stockbury in January but there is no excuse for putting up your feet, there are dozens of jobs to carry out now but what is required is good planning as well.

Its too late to plant trees and shrubs with the ground too cold at the moment, but be patient and wait until the end of February to do that and even then, no later than the end of March for best results, That is because after that you will need to constantly water especially if we have a dry spring.

Seeds can be purchased and an evening browsing through the various seed catalogues will pay dividends, there is not much difference between the common suppliers of veg and flower seeds, as they all purchase them from China!!! Try looking at specialist suppliers, one of which is Franchi Seeds, they have an online shop, however if you go to our village shop, you will find a rack of seed packets twice the size of the "gang of five" as I call them and the contents are also at least three times as much. I find germination (success rate) very good as well.

Keep an eye on the next issue of The Observer to find out what is happening at our meetings for 2018 and for those of you who wish to renew your membership its £10 for the year. For those that are interested, for that annual fee we have 11 meetings, at least 4/5 visiting speakers presenting talks on a vast range of topics. There are benefits too of massive discounts at garden centres, reduced entry and some free admissions to RHS Gardens and various shows and competitions in our village hall. We are affiliated to the National Vegetable Society and the Kent Federation of Horticultural Societies. WOW!! is that not a good enough reason to join us?

If you have moved house since getting your current bus pass and you haven't told us, make sure you let us know so that your new bus pass arrives at the right place.
