Three years out of every four, some residents will be asked to the polls. Not only is this a costly way of administering local government but it also fails to assure a stable local government which would be able to plan ahead for more than next May.

I am treading on very thin ice saying this here: the mere support or criticism of the electoral system may be construed as a party-political statement which is VERBOTEN! - during Purdah.

Purdah? I hear you ask – no nothing religious but a publicity restriction that will apply after the Notice of Election is published: from now until <u>after</u> the next edition of The Observer.

During this time neither Council nor members are allowed to issue any publicity which appears designed to affect support for a candidate or political party or could otherwise be regarded as influencing voters.....

Boom goes my monthly rant, which I like to believe is enjoyed by the dear Stockbury Observer reader.....

I'll be back in June then, - bye bye!

#### **Very Thin Ice Territory:**

- 1) correction regarding last month's article: At full council I did not raise the issue of the ANOB partnership, as initially planned. This was requested by the Partnership themselves in fear of unintended consequences. Enough said but the fight will continue......
- The Kent Downs Management Plan is currently being reviewed. Please get involved and feed into the revision of the plan - it is only a 10min survey. Please follow this link <u>https://</u> www.surveymonkey.co.uk/r/RCJVRDC
- Lots of issues happening around the Kent Medical site at Junction 7. There will be a full briefing for members while this magazine is being printed. I shall feed back next month.
- Oh yes, it was decided by Full Council that the MBC element of the Council Tax goes up by 3%

5) A delegation of North Downs community representatives met with the Police & Crimes Commissioner, Matthew Scott. He was very sympathetic to our rural concerns and presented us with very practical solutions, which Kent Police is currently introducing. Over 400 new staff are being recruited; that is 200 extra staff when considering natural wastage. We will soon have a new PCSO for the village and (s)he will regularly visit Parish Council meetings; at least once every three months. An improvement over the past 6 or 8 months when we've had no visit. The most striking thing I remember is that new recruits will be asked about their desired career path from the very start. Being a village PCSO shall no longer be a foot in the door for a career in CID. Village PCSOs are supposed to be experts in their community and this expertise is valued and should be retained.



6) Purdah or not I shall continue to be at the end of the phone line or my email in-box and listen to your concerns and be ready to advocate on your behalf in the Halls of Power.

covers over peach and pear blossom that were threatening to show. Who would believe that in direct contrast to last spring that we would have had such a cold period? Nature is a great leveller. So where is global warming when required?? It will make my gardening tips easy, for April,

read last March's letter!

This March the temperature reached minus 19 °C, the coldest March for 85 years, no wonder wild life is confused. Whilst on a recent trip to



Camber Sands I encountered this penguin who was trying to set up a colony. Wow! that was cold!

I hope those of you whom use the village pub have noticed the latest information board. Hanging on it is this year's schedule for the Stockbury Gardeners, please take time to browse through it, details of the years calendar for all to view, however feel free to take the information home but re-place the schedule before you leave.

For those of you that are interested, the robin is still following me around the garden, however now once he has fed from my hand he leaves me at high speed.....I rather feel he has other things on his mind at the moment, let's hope so!

In the large pond we had frogspawn on the 12<sup>th</sup> March but a few days later the water was frozen, I hope its all going to be OK.

In the greenhouse last week I had to open a few windows to cool it down, and in doing so disturbed a whole colony of lacewings hibernating in the frame, now that is a good sign.

- You should now be ready to prune roses.
- Sow peas and parsnips once the ground warms up
- Sow basil, beetroot, broccoli and calabrese
- Most brassica (cabbage family)
- Carrot, cauliflower celery, celeriac, French beans, and courgette
- Cucumbers indoors, pumpkin and squash family.
- Onions, salad plants lettuce etc. tomatoes asap or buy in plants.

#### Stockbury Short Mat Bowls Club

We are a friendly club who meet in the Memorial Hall every Tuesday at 2pm until 4pm. and every Thursday, except the first Thursday in the month, 7.30 pm to 9.30pm.

Short Mat Bowls is an indoor variation of lawn bowls and indoor bowls as seen on TV. As its name implies it is played on a short mat which can be 40 to 45 ft long. This means that it can be played in



most village halls. It is an excellent and fun way to get gentle exercise and can be played by anyone regardless of age, gender or ability.

In Stockbury we have two 45ft mats. We play mostly for fun but we do have a team, "The Spitfires" in the Swale Winter League.
